## Perpetrator Referral Pathway

Perpetrator discloses using family violence to a non-specialist service. If perpetrator presents an immediate threat, Police are notified.

Referral may be made to services providing Men's Behavioural Change Program or Men's Case Management, or Other Support Services.




Services use the Family Violence Information Sharing Scheme and MARAM to assess and manage risk. Family Violence Service

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Police attend family violence incident and make formal referral (L17) to Enhanced Men's Intake.

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A perpetrator of family violence attends court due to a Family Violence Intervention Order and may be referred to Men's Behavioural Change Program or Men's Case Management, or Other Support Services.

Family Violence Services can help adult and child victim survivors of family violence. Some Family Violence Services can also help people who use family violence to take responsibility and change their behaviour.



A perpetrator of family violence can contact a Family Violence Service and self-refer.
